



## Valley View Optional Pot game information

**Saturday play:** Saturday will pay 1st, 2nd and 3rd low gross and net.

- \$8 per person - \$2 low gross, \$2 low net, \$1 2<sup>nd</sup> low gross and net, \$1 3<sup>rd</sup> low gross and net.
- \$4 CTP's
- \$11 skins
- \$1 golf course tip
- \$1 club
- =\$25

**Monday play:** Monday will pay 1st and 2nd place (gross and net).

- \$8 per person - \$3 low gross, \$3 low net, \$1 2<sup>nd</sup> low gross, \$1 2<sup>nd</sup> low net
- \$4 CTP's
- \$11 skins
- \$1 golf course tip
- \$1 club
- =\$25

**Monthly play:** For Valley View play, there will be an A and B flight when the club has 20 players or more for the event.

- Buy-in - \$35
- Includes 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> winners (gross and net), skins and CTP's.

**Tee Box assignments:** The Tournament Director will assign a default tee box for players. When weather is a factor, it will be at the discretion of the tournament director to adjust tee box assignments.

- +0 thru 5.9 - Tips
- 6.0 thru 18 - 1 box up
- 18.1 & higher - 2 box up
- Ladies - Forward box
- Age 60 and above can play 1 box up from the box assigned by handicap index.

## Understanding the USGA rules of golf

- Scoring: The USGA Handicap System rules specify that a player's course handicap are computed based on the slope, rating and par of the tee being played. Additionally, it is required that adjustments be made to account for the difference in par on the different tees being played.
- Desert area will be treated as a penalty area, therefore if you find your ball you may play it or utilize USGA rule 17. No unplayable in a penalty area.
- Model local rule E5 in affect; (out of bounds) if you think your ball is out of bounds for two penalty strokes you may drop a ball from where it last crossed the out of ball boundary up till two clubs lengths into the fairway. The same procedure for a lost ball, the drop shall be from the approximate area where the ball is deemed to be lost up to two club lengths into the fairway.
- Model local rule F-5.1 in affect. Immovable obstruction near putting green (sprinkler head) if the immovable obstruction is on the line of play and is on or within two club lengths of the putting green and within two club lengths of the ball you can take relief.
- Relief from Tree Roots: If a player's ball is at rest in a portion of the general area surrounded by grass and there is interference from exposed tree roots that are in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less, the tree roots are treated as ground under repair. The player may take free relief under Rule 16.1b. However, interference does not exist if the tree roots only interfere with the player's stance.
- Pace of play: It is imperative that we maintain a pace of play, do not sit in the cart and watch your partner hit, go to your ball and be ready to hit. Keep pace with the group in front of you.
